## Chapter 513.

AN ACT to repeal and re-enact with amendments the act of the General Assembly of Maryland, chapter four hundred and fifteen, passed at January session, eighteen hundred and seventy-eight, entitled An act to repeal and re-enact with amendments section two, three, nine, ten and eleven of chapter two hundred and thirty-three of the acts of the General Assembly of Maryland, passed at January session, eighteen hundred and seventy-four, entitled An act to establish the Maryland House of Correction.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the act of the General Assembly of Maryland, chapter four hundred and fifteen, passed at January session, eighteen hundred and seventy-eight, entitled An act to repeal and re-enact with amendments section two, three, nine, ten and eleven of chapter two hundred and thirty-three of the act of the General Assembly of Maryland, passed at January session, eighteen hundred and seventy-four, entitled An act to establish the Maryland House of Correction, be and the same is hereby repealed and reenacted with amendments so as to read as follows:

SEC. 2. And be it enacted, That the said board of managers of the House of Correction shall consist of the following persons: the governor, comptroller, Board of manaattorney general and treasurer for the time being shall be ex-officio members of said board, and the governor shall appoint three persons who shall serve as members of said board without compensation for the term of six years from the first day of May next, and he shall also appoint three persons who shall serve as members of said board, without compensation, for the term of four years from the first day of May next, and shall also appoint three persons who shall serve as members of said board, without compensation, for the term of two years from the first day of May next, and the same board shall be a body corporate under the title of the Board of Managers of the Maryland House of Correction, and have powers to make such by-laws. rules and regulations not inconsistent with law as they Powers.
