may deem necessary and proper for the public welfare and the best interest of the institution and its inmates, and shall also have power to appoint the necessary officers and agents and fix their compensation, who shall be removable at their pleasure, and shall make an annual report on the first Monday in January in each and every year of their proceedings to the Governor of the state, who shall submit the same with such recommendations as he may deem proper to the general

assembly at its session thereafter.

Governor shall appoint.

Three classes.

Annual report.

Sec. 3. And be it enacted, That upon the expiration of each of terms of office of the board of managers hereinbefore provided for, the Governor shall appoint three persons residents of this state for the term of six years from the first of May next ensuing their appointment, and until their successors are qualified; and shall appoint from time to time during the continuance of said institution as said terms expire, three persons residents as aforesaid, for the full term of six years, so that the board of managers shall be divided into three classes, one-third of whom shall go out of office at the end of two years, and shall also have power in the case of any vacancy occurring in any of said classes from death, resignation or removal from the state, to appoint a person or persons to fill such vacancy or vacancies for the balance of the term of said class; provided, that all persons who shall be appointed members of said board shall serve without compensation.

Proviso.

Court may sentence. Sec. 8. And be it enacted, That whenever any person may be convicted in any of the courts of this state for any crime or misdemeanor, and who is liable under existing law to be sentenced to imprisonment for a period not less than two months and not exceeding one year, such court may, in its discretion, sentence such persons to be confined in said House of Correc-

tion, instead of other place of confinement.

SEC. 9. And be it enacted, That it shall be the duty of any justice of the peace of this state to cause to be arrested and, on due proof, to commit any vagrant, habitually disorderly person, not insane, to said House of Correction for a period not less than two months nor more than six months, and on a second or subsequent commitment of the same person for any of the said causes, he or she,
