Enforce this act.
Report quarterly.
 SEC. 33. *And be it enacted,* That it shall be the duty of the deputy commanders of the sloops to confine themselves ordinarily to their several districts, but it shall also be their duty to enforce any of the provisions of this act in any waters adjacent to their districts when a violation of the same shall come to their knowledge; and that they shall report quarterly to the comptroller the amount of moneys received for license issued to persons engaged in carrying oysters taken in this state, and on receiving his warrant shall pay the same into the treasury.

Officers take oath.
Bond.
 SEC. 34. *And be it enacted,* That the commanding officer and the deputy commanders of said force shall, before entering upon the discharge of their duties, take before one of the judges of the circuit courts the oath prescribed by the constitution, and the commanding officer of said force shall enter into bond to the State of Maryland in the sum of ten thousand dollars, and each deputy commander in the sum of three thousand dollars, to be approved by said judges, for the faithful performance of their duties, as prescribed in this act, the said bond or bonds to be filed with the comptroller.

Salary of officials.
 SEC. 35. *And be it enacted,* That the salary of the commander shall be fifteen hundred dollars, and the deputy commanders in charge of steamers shall be one thousand dollars per annum, and they shall have power to appoint one officer at a salary of six hundred dollars per annum, one engineer or machinist at eight hundred dollars per annum, and one assistant at a salary of five hundred dollars, two seamen at twenty-five dollars per month, two firemen at twenty-five dollars per month, one steward at twenty dollars per month, and one cook at twenty dollars per month, and each deputy commander of sloops or vessels shall receive a salary of eight hundred dollars per annum; he shall have the power to appoint one officer at a salary of five hundred and fifty dollars per annum, and four seamen at a salary of forty dollars per month during the oyster season, and thirty dollars per month after the season, each to be selected from the district in which they are to serve.
