have power at any time to remit or release the fines, penalties and forfeitures, or any part thereof, at their discretion; but any party fined, or subject to any fine or forfeiture, may, within five days after the same shall be imposed and judgment recorded, supersede or stay the same for thirty days by giving ample personal security to the justice of the peace; and any party subject to a fine, penalty or forfeiture by virtue of any of the provisions of this act, shall have a right Appeals. to appeal within five days thereafter to the circuit court for Garrett county, and shall have a right, if he so elect, to a trial by jury, and the fines and forfeitures imposed and collected by any of the provisions of this act may be paid by said commissioners to the bailiff as compensation for his services, or the said commissioners may make such other disposition of said fines and forfeitures as they may deem best.

SEC. 11. And be it enacted, That the said commissioners may provide for levying and collecting an annual tax of fifty cents on the owner of every dog and one dollar on the owner of every bitch within the said Dog tax. town, and the killing of every dog and bitch whose owner cannot be ascertained, or whose owner shall refuse to pay or who shall fail to do so within one

month from the time he shall be notified.

SEC. 12. And be it enacted, That the said commissioners may cause each male inhabitant of said town of twenty-one years of age and upwards to work in the work in streets streets, lanes and alleys of said town, under the supervision of the bailiff, one day in each year; and if any person as aforesaid, after having been summoned in writing one day previous to the day appointed by the bailiff for working the streets, shall fail to appear or provide some one in his stead, the said person shall, upon conviction before a justice of the peace, be fined one dollar and costs, and the bailiff shall receive for Penalty. his services under this section not exceeding one dollar per day that he is actually engaged in working said streets.

Sec. 13. And be it enacted, That the commissioners may annually levy a tax for the expenses of the corporation upon the taxable property within the town limits, real and personal, except public and private Levy tax. securities and book accounts and such properties as may be occupied by churches and public schools, and the same shall be collected by a collector appointed by
