

tioned that he will well and faithfully account for all moneys received by him from the collector of said corporation, or any other person, for the use of said town, and will also well and faithfully pay over to the said commissioners, or their order, all sums of money so received by him, and deliver over the books and papers of his office, whenever required so to do by the said commissioners, and the said bond shall be recorded in the office of the clerk of the circuit court for Garrett county; and the said commissioners shall allow their treasurer such compensation for his services as they may deem reasonable and just.

Compensation.

SEC. 17. *And be it enacted*, That the said commissioners shall annually appoint a bailiff of said town, and prescribe his duties, and for compensation for his services as bailiff, the said commissioners shall allow him all or part of the fines and forfeitures received for the violation of the town ordinances, and no more. The said bailiff shall enforce the ordinances of said town, and in the execution of the duties of his office, shall have all and the same powers as constables in criminal cases. The said bailiff, upon entering upon the duties of his office, shall make oath before one of the said commissioners that he will faithfully and impartially execute the duties of his office according to the best of his skill and judgment, without favor or prejudice, and shall also give bond to the State of Maryland in such penalty as the commissioners may direct, and with sureties to be by them approved, for the faithful performance of his duties as bailiff, and the said bond shall be recorded in the office of the clerk of the circuit court of Garrett county.

SEC. 18. *And be it enacted*, That the said commissioners may purchase a suitable piece of land, and cause to be erected thereon a strong room or lock-up for the detention of violators of the ordinances of the said town.

SEC. 19. *And be it enacted*, That said commissioners may pass all ordinances necessary to give effect and operation to the powers vested in them.

Ordinances necessary.

SEC. 20. *And be it enacted*, That all ordinances enacted by the said commissioners shall be immediately made public by printed or written hand-bills posted in no less than three conspicuous places in said town.
