

and eighty perches; thence north twenty-six and a-half degrees, west eighty perches to the beginning.

SEC. 4. *Be it enacted*, That there shall be five commissioners for said town, who shall hold office for two years from the date of their election, or until their successors are duly elected and qualified, who shall be elected by ballot by the qualified voters of said town, and who shall be at least twenty-five years of age and a bona fide resident of said town for at least twelve months next preceding the date of his election, and shall also possess in his own right, or in the right of his wife, real or leasehold property in said town of the assessed value of two hundred dollars.

Term and qualifications of the commissioners.

SEC. 5. *Be it enacted*, That the male inhabitants of said town above the age of twenty-one years, who have resided in said town for six months next preceding the date of election, shall possess the qualifications of electors of commissioners for said town. The qualified voters of said town shall, on the first Monday in May, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, between the hours of twelve o'clock m. and five p. m., and in like manner every two years thereafter, elect by ballot five persons of known integrity, experience and sound judgment, to be commissioners of said town.

Electors qualifications.

Election—when held.

SEC. 6. *Be it enacted*, That it shall be the duty of the commissioners of said town, at the first election to be held under this act, as provided in the preceding section, and at every election thereafter, to appoint three judges of election, one of whom, at least, shall be of the opposite political party, and shall give notice of the time and polling place and names of the judges appointed as aforesaid; such notice shall be posted in two conspicuous places, at least five days before election; each of said persons so, as aforesaid, appointed judge of election shall, before he proceeds to act as such judge, make oath before a justice of the peace for the said county, or one of the commissioners of said town, that he will faithfully and impartially discharge the duties of his office, and upon failure of any judge to attend, the remaining judge or judges shall hold the election, and if none of the judges attend, the citizens present shall select three judges. The said judges of election, on the day of election and immediately after the polls are closed, shall count the ballots and certify the result to said
