and they shall also have the power to alter and repair, or to take down, remove and rebuild the said meeting house on its old site, or as near thereto as may be most suitable, and to dedicate the same for perpetual use as a chapel for the performance of funeral services in all cases of burial in said county.

Chapter 7.
