

and to open, widen, straighten or close up the same in whole or in part, provided free access is allowed to all public roads running to the limits of the town through the highways of the town.

Fees of police justices.

Furnished with copies of ordinances.

Make out summarized statement.

SEC. 134. For the enforcement of the town ordinances the police justices shall have all the power of ordering arrests and summoning witnesses that is now vested in them by law, and they shall be entitled to demand and receive the same fees as in other criminal proceedings; but the mayor and council may determine and fix an annual salary to be paid to said justices quarterly, and in such case they shall impose no justices' fees in the trial of cases before them. Each of said justices shall be furnished with copies of the ordinances of the town, and each shall keep a separate docket for corporation cases, and therein record and make regular entries of his proceedings in all such cases, setting forth the fine or imprisonment imposed and the amount of costs, and he shall submit said docket to the inspection of any person who may request to see the same, and upon demand of any person interested shall deliver a copy of any judgment rendered by him. It shall be the duty of said justices to make out a summarized statement of all corporation cases tried before them, with the fines and costs therein collected, which statement shall be submitted quarterly to the council, after being sworn to before the mayor. Upon the request of the council the said justices shall produce their dockets and may be placed under oath and interrogated as to the entries therein. They shall pay over to the tax collector, quarterly, all fines by them collected.

Liable to indictment.

SEC. 135. That if either of the justices of the peace appointed by the mayor and council neglect to discharge any of the duties imposed upon him by this act, or refuse to pay over the fines by him collected, as herein directed, he shall be liable to indictment in the circuit court for Washington county, and upon conviction he shall be fined the sum of fifty dollars, or be imprisoned in the county jail for a term not exceeding three months, or both, in the discretion of the court.

Right of appeal

SEC. 136. From any judgment rendered by either of the police justices in the enforcement of the ordinances of the town, an appeal shall lie by the person aggrieved, to the circuit court for Washington county, provided the appeal is taken within three days after
