

Payment. John N. Henman the sum of four hundred and sixty-nine dollars and sixty-one cents out of any money in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated.

Effective. SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 82.

AN ACT to authorize and require the Comptroller of the Treasury to issue his warrant upon the Treasurer for the payment of a sum of money to the Delaware, Maryland and Virginia Railroad Company, for a certain sum erroneously paid into the State Treasury by the Worcester Railroad Company.

Preamble. WHEREAS the Worcester Railroad Company, on the third day of July, in the year eighteen hundred and eighty-three, a corporation using steam, duly incorporated, and then existing under the laws of the State of Maryland, and doing business in said State, did pay to John N. Henman, Collector of State taxes for Worcester county for the year eighteen hundred and eighty-two, the sum of one hundred and thirty-one dollars and fifty-nine cents, in full of State tax claimed to be due to the State of Maryland for the year eighteen hundred and eighty-two, from said Worcester Railroad Company, which said sum of money the said John N. Henman, as collector as aforesaid, paid into the Treasury of the State of Maryland; and
