

although abated, is likely to recur on the same premises, he shall make an order on such person or persons, firm or corporation, requiring him, them or it to comply with any or all the requisitions of the notice, or otherwise to abate the nuisance, within a time specified in the order, or an order both requiring abatement and prohibiting the recurrence of the nuisance, as far as practicable.

SEC. 3. *And be it enacted*, That wherever the nuisance is created or maintained by more than one person, firm or corporation, the said Judge may make such order with reference to the abatement of the same, and the person or persons by whom the same shall be executed, and by whom and in what proportions the cost of such abatement or work shall be paid, as to him may seem reasonable; provided, that the said Judge may suspend his final determination, on condition that the person or persons, firm or corporation, complained of, undertakes to adopt within a reasonable time, such means as the said Judge may deem practicable and may order to be carried into effect for abating such nuisance, or for mitigating or preventing any effluvia prejudicial to health which may arise therefrom.

SEC. 4. *And be it enacted*, That any person or persons, firm or corporation, not obeying an order made by any one of the aforesaid Judges to comply with the requisitions of the State Board of Health, or otherwise to abate the nuisance complained of, shall, if all due diligence has not been used to carry out such order, be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten dollars per day during his or their default; and any person or persons, firm or corporation, knowingly or wilfully acting contrary to an order of abatement or prohibition, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty dollars per day during such contrary action, and the person or persons, corporation or corporations not obeying, or wilfully acting contrary
