

and eighty-seven, at the same places where county and city elections are now held by law for the election of Delegates to the General Assembly, every person entitled to vote for Delegates to the General Assembly shall be entitled to vote on the question of a call of a convention for altering the Constitution, or framing a new one, by expressing in writing or in printed form the words "For a Convention," or "Against a Convention," as the case may be, and in case there shall be any ballots without the designation above prescribed, the same shall not be counted for or against a convention, but a separate return shall be made by the Judges of Election; and it is hereby provided, that the Sheriffs of the several counties and the Sheriff of Baltimore city shall give notice of the day above designated for holding said election for a call of a convention in the same manner and for the same time as required for notice of the election of members of the General Assembly.

SEC. 2. That it shall be the duty of the several Judges of Elections of this State to receive, accurately count, and duly return the number of ballots so cast to the several Clerks of the counties of this State and to the Clerk of the Superior Court of Baltimore city as the same are now required to be returned for the election of Members of the House of Delegates, and the several Clerks aforesaid shall return to the Governor within ten days after said election the number of ballots cast for and against the call for a convention and the number of ballots without the designation aforesaid.

SEC. 3. That as soon as the Governor shall receive the return of the number of ballots at said election for and against a convention and for the number of ballots without the prescribed designation, which may be termed blank ballots, it shall be the duty of the Governor to count and cast up the same, and thereupon make proclamation of the result of said count.
