

States, ability to read and write, and physical strength and courage; no person who has been convicted and sentenced to the Penitentiary, shall be eligible to the position of officer of police, policeman, detective or special policeman; the pay of an ordinary policeman shall be eighteen dollars per week, payable semi-monthly; and in case the Board shall appoint detective policemen, and they are hereby authorized and empowered to do so, if they shall think fit, to the number of ten; said detectives shall receive the sum of twenty-three dollars per week, payable semi-monthly, and shall not be allowed to follow any business or profession, but shall devote their time to the discharge of their duties as detectives; the officers of police shall be paid semi-monthly, and their pay shall be as follows: the Marshal receive twenty-five hundred dollars per annum; the Deputy Marshal shall receive two thousand dollars per annum; each Captain shall receive thirty dollars per week; each Lieutenant twenty-five dollars per week; each Sergeant twenty dollars per week; and each Turnkey eighteen dollars per week; the pay herein provided for police officers, policemen and detectives shall continue in force until a change shall be made by an act of the General Assembly.
