two seats, if there be one duly elected, the person so elected shall immediately qualify as Commissioner, and shall proclaim a new election to supply the vacancy or vacancies occasioned by the failure to elect, and shall give at least five days' notice of said election, which shall be held in the same manner as the regular elections are held.

SEC. 6. And be it enacted, That if it shall not appear that one of the persons voted for has been duly elected, or if the person or persons duly elected shall fail to qualify, and proclaim a new election for the space of five days, the old Board of Commissioners, or a majority of them, shall assemble and proclaim a new election giving at least five days' notice thereof.

New election.

SEC. 7. Be it enacted, That in case of death, refusal to act, resignation or disqualification of any the Commissioners, the remaining Commissioner or Commissioners, shall direct an election to be held to fill such vacancy, and the Commissioners or remaining Commissioner shall give at least five days' notice of all elections by hand-bill set up at three of the most public places in said town.

In case of death, etc.

Sec. 8. And be it enacted, That the Commissioners so elected, may meet and adjourn from time to time as they may think proper, and shall, at their first meeting, which shall be within one month after their election, choose from their own body a President, who shall preside at the meetings of the Commissioners. vote on the questions before them, and remain in office until superseded by the appointment of a new President after a new election of Commissioners, and shall also elect, but not necessarily from their own number, a Secretary and Treasurer, who shall continue in office during the term for which said Commissioners are elected, unless sooner removed by said Commissioners, and require and take from the

President.
