

son or persons charged with said violation of the provisions of this act; the boat shall be held by the Judge or Justice before whom the party charged with the violation is taken for hearing or trial; the Justice shall hear and determine any charge against the owner of said boat; if a non-resident of the county, or if the offence has been committed with the knowledge and consent of the owner, he shall adjudge and impose a fine, as aforesaid, upon said owner and hold the boat for twenty days, if said fine and cost are not sooner paid; at the end of which time he shall direct and authorize the Sheriff or Deputy Sheriff of said county, after having given ten days' public notice in an advertisement in some newspaper printed in Cambridge, and by hand-bills, to sell said boat for cash to the highest bidder and deduct the fine and all the costs, including three per cent. commissions for making the sale, and pay over the balance to the owner or owners of said boat or lien creditors according to their legal rights thereto as adjusted by the Auditor of said Circuit Court.

SEC. 12. *And be it enacted*, That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 208.

AN ACT to lay out and establish a new election district in Garrett county out of the First and Tenth Election Districts, and to be called District Number Twelve.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That a new election district be laid out and established out of the First and Tenth Election Districts of Garrett county, the said new district to be known and called Number Twelve, of Garrett county.
