CHAPTER 315.

AN ACT to provide for the measurement of cord-wood in the city of Baltimore, and also to repeal all provisions of the Code inconsistent therewith.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That all stick-wood sold by retail in the city of Baltimore, shall be measured in a solid frame made of wood or iron; that a frame to measure one-eighth of a cord shall not be larger than ten feet two inches around on the inside; that a frame to measure one-fourth of a cord shall not be larger than twelve feet four inches around on the inside; that a frame to measure threeeighths of a cord shall not be larger than fourteen feet six inches around on the inside: that a frame to measure one-half a cord shall not be larger than sixteen feet eight inches around on the inside; that all frames shall be measured and stamped every year by the Inspector, just as carts are measured and stamped.

SEC. 2. And be it enacted, That if any wood-dealer shall sell stick-wood by retail in the city of Baltimore, measured otherwise than in a frame, he or they shall be subject to the penalty of five dollars for each offence; one-half of the penalty to go to the informer; said penalty to be recovered before some Justice of the Peace.

Sawed wood.

Sec. 3. And be it enacted, That this act shall not apply to the measurement of sawed and split wood.
