

lis, has been cast against the sale of spirituous or fermented liquors or alcoholic bitters, or if the vote thereon shall be a tie vote, that the then said Local Option Law of eighteen hundred and eighty-two, shall remain in full force in said city; but if it shall be found by the return of said Judges of Elections and proclamation of said Clerk, that a majority of all the votes cast as prescribed in the preceding sections in said city of Annapolis has been cast for the sale of said spirituous or fermented liquors or alcoholic bitters, then the same may be sold in the city of Annapolis, as allowed under the License Laws of this State, subject to the provisions hereinafter mentioned.

SEC. 4. *And be it enacted*, That section fifty-five of article second, of the Code of Public Local Laws, title "Anne Arundel County," subtitle "Annapolis," as the same was amended and re-enacted by the several acts of eighteen hundred and sixty-five, chapter eighty-seven; eighteen hundred and sixty-six, chapter one hundred and forty-four; eighteen hundred and sixty-seven, chapter three hundred and ninety, and eighteen hundred and seventy-six, chapter two hundred and seventy-three, relating to the sale of spirituous and fermented liquors to minors in the city of Annapolis, and within five miles thereof, be and the same is hereby revived and re-enacted so as to read as follows:

SECTION 55. "It shall not be lawful for any person, corporation or association, whether licensed to sell spirituous liquors or not, to sell, dispose of, barter or give, directly or indirectly within the corporate limits of the city of Annapolis, or within five miles thereof, any spirituous or fermented liquors or cordials of any kind, or in any quantity whatever, to any youth or minor under the age of twenty-one years, without the written order or consent of the parent or guardian of such minor, nor to any midshipman or student connected with or at-
