

Peace, in every case shall have the right of appeal to the Circuit Court for Worcester county.

SEC. 8. *And be it enacted*, That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 388.

AN ACT to provide for the appropriation of a sum of money to aid in the erection of a monument to Francis Scott Key by the Francis Scott Key Monument Association in the city of Baltimore.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That the sum of fifteen thousand dollars be and the same is hereby appropriated to aid in the erection of a monument to Francis Scott Key in the city of Baltimore by the Francis Scott Key Monument Association, and the Comptroller of the Treasury is hereby authorized and directed to draw his warrant on the Treasurer of the State for the said sum of fifteen thousand dollars payable to said association whenever it shall be shown to him that the subscriptions from other sources for this same purpose have been made and actually paid amounting to the sum of thirty-five thousand dollars and the work of building said monument has been commenced; said subscriptions and this appropriation to be under the control and management of a Board of six Trustees, consisting of James R. Willing; John S. Gilman, President of the Second National Bank of Baltimore, George S. Brown, Banker, A. S. Abell, J. D. Wheeler, Jr., Cashier of the Drovers' and Mechanics' National Bank of Baltimore, and Dr. Walter W. White.
