issued under this act shall be paid into the Treasury and be set apart as a specific fund to pay the cost and expenses of conducting the analysis provided for in section three of this act, and the Treasurer shall annually pay over to the Maryland Agricultural College the money received from sale of said license; provided, that no larger sum than two thousand dollars shall be paid over in any one year.

Fine for vio-  
lation.

SEC. 5. *And be it enacted*, That whoever sells or offers for sale a commercial fertilizer without first taking out the license required by this act, or without the label required by this act, or with a label stating that said fertilizer contains a larger percentage of any one or more of the constituents mentioned in section two of this act than it actually contains, or shall fail to return the statement of excess sold, as provided in section two, shall, on conviction thereof in any Court of competent jurisdiction, be fined not more than two hundred dollars.

SEC. 6. *And be it enacted*, That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage.
