eral of the State, shall be, ex officio, a member of the Commission; 5th, No member of said Commission shall in any way, directly or indirectly, have any pecuniary interest in any place in which the insane are confined, or in the management or supplies or treatment of such insane.

SEC. 17. And be it enacted, That the members of said Commission, except the Secretary, shall receive no compensation for their services except such necessary expenses as may be incurred in the performance of their duties; the same to be paid by the Comptroller of the Treasury on the presentation of an itemized account, with the proper vouchers, but the Comptroller shall have the power to refuse payment of expenses which he may decide to be unnecessary.

Sec. 18. And be it enacted, That said "Lunacy Commission" shall appoint a Secretary, who shall be a qualified Physician, who shall record the transactions of the Commission, and perform such other duties as may be ordered by the Commission in the execution of their

duties; the salary of the Secretary shall be one thousand dollars per annum, besides his actual expenses incurred in the performance of his duties; the said Commission shall make such by-laws and regulations not inconsistent with this act, as in their judgment may be required for the better fulfilment of their duties.

SEC. 19. And be it enacted, That said Lunacy Commission shall meet at least once in three months, and that said Commission shall be required to meet at any time when a call for such meeting shall be desired by any two members made to the Secretary in writing.

Sec. 20. And be it enacted, That the Secretary, or at least one member of said Commission appointed for the purpose by the Board, shall visit all public, corporate or private institu-
