

the highest bidder of any found false or untrue; the renting of the stalls and shambles of the market, and for the seizure and sale for the use of the Commissioners of all butter in prints or parcels brought to the said market for sale found wanting in weight, or unsound or unwholesome.

SEC. 33. That the Bailiffs of the town shall have charge of and supervision over the market-house and markets therein, under the direction and control of the Commissioners.

Supervision.

SEC. 34. That if any person shall feel aggrieved by any seizure made by the Bailiffs he may, within three days after such seizure, appeal to the Commissioners, or any one of them, who shall make such order therein as they may or he may deem just.

Appeal.

SEC. 35. That the rent of the stalls and shambles of the market-house may be recovered in the name of the Commissioners before a Justice of the Peace as small debts are recovered.

Rent of stalls.

SEC. 36. That the Commissioners may provide by by-laws and ordinances for preventing swine from being raised within the limits of said town, except in pens or enclosures, and for keeping the same free from bad odors and filth, and may in like manner provide that if any swine, geese or other animals be found going at large within the limits of said town, they shall be impounded by the Bailiffs and sold to pay the costs of impounding and keeping and a reasonable fine for such offence; provided, that the owner of said swine, geese or other animals, does not come forward and pay or tender to pay all reasonable costs that have occurred in the impounding and keeping such swine, geese or other animals, as well as such fine as may be imposed by law.
