

1752. **MILITARY SERVICE:** captain, by 1739; colonel, by 1756. **WEALTH DURING LIFETIME.** LAND AT FIRST ELECTION: 600 acres in Delaware (inherited from his father), plus 150 acres of leasehold land in Cecil County. Probably managed an additional 868 acres that his father bequeathed to Peter's underage brothers, the control of which he relinquished after they became of age. **WEALTH AT DEATH.** DIED: will probated on November 26, 1766, in Cecil County. **PERSONAL PROPERTY:** TEV, at least £920.9.10 current money (including 9 slaves and books). **LAND:** 600 acres on Bombay Hook Island, Delaware; 150 acres of leasehold land on Bohemia Manor, Cecil County.

BAYLEY, GODFREY (?-ca. 1670/71). BORN: in England. **IMMIGRATED:** in 1658 as a free adult from London, England. **RESIDED:** in Baltimore County. **FAMILY BACKGROUND.** Rose, probably the widow of John Scotcher. **CHILDREN.** DAUGHTERS: Elizabeth, who married *George Warner* (by 1657-1703); Rosamund. **PRIVATE CAREER.** EDUCATION: literate. **SOCIAL STATUS AND ACTIVITIES:** brought five others and some capital with him on his arrival in the colony; Gent., by late 1658. **OCCUPATIONAL PROFILE:** factor for John Bayspoole, of London, England; merchant; planter. **PUBLIC CAREER.** LEGISLATIVE SERVICE: Lower House, Baltimore County, 1659/60. **LOCAL OFFICE:** justice, Baltimore County, 1664-1664/65. **STANDS ON PUBLIC/PRIVATE ISSUES:** supported Fendall's Rebellion, but was pardoned in 1661. **WEALTH DURING LIFETIME.** LAND AT FIRST ELECTION: ca. 400 acres. **WEALTH AT DEATH.** DIED: will probated on January 5, 1670/71. **PERSONAL PROPERTY:** TEV, £306.6.0 sterling; FB, 19,723 pounds of tobacco. **LAND:** unspecified acreage valued at 40,000 pounds of tobacco.

BAYLY (BAILEY, BAILLIE, BAYLEY), MOUNTJOY (1755-1836). BORN: in 1755 in Virginia. **IMMIGRATED:** first generation from Virginia; may have been of Scottish origin. **RESIDED:** in Frederick Town, Frederick County, 1785. **FAMILY BACKGROUND.** FATHER: William Bayly (1715-1782), of Fairfax County, Virginia. MOTHER: Mary, daughter of Wade Hampton, of South Carolina. **BROTHERS:** Pierce (1742-1800), of Loudoun County, Virginia, who married Mary Payne; *William Bayly* (ca. 1742-1824); Samuel (ca. 1749-?); Joseph (ca. 1752-1789), who married Elizabeth; Tarpley (1756-?), of Berkeley County, Virginia; and Robert (1759-?). **SISTERS:** Sarah (ca. 1745-ca. 1785), who married Robert Rogers (?-1786); Nancy, who married in 1762 John Singleton; and

Betty, who married Robert Boggess. **MARRIED** by 1784 Elizabeth (1760-1832), daughter of *Christopher Edelin* (?-ca. 1786). Her sisters were Eleanor (1762-?), who married Capt. *John Lynn* (1760-1813); Rebecca (1765-?). **CHILDREN.** SONS: Benjamin (1783-1836); Richard (1785-?). **DAUGHTERS:** Eleanor, who married (first name unknown) Hanson; Elizabeth, who married (first name unknown) Eaton. **PRIVATE CAREER.** EDUCATION: literate. **RELIGIOUS AFFILIATION:** Presbyterian. **SOCIAL STATUS AND ACTIVITIES:** Gent., 1799, charter member of the Society of Cincinnati. **OCCUPATIONAL PROFILE:** probably a planter; officeholder. **PUBLIC CAREER.** LEGISLATIVE SERVICE: Lower House, Frederick County, 1785, 1786-1787, 1789, 1790, 1793. **LOCAL OFFICES:** auctioneer, Frederick County, 1780. **MILITARY SERVICE:** captain, Seventh Maryland Regiment, 1776, resigned 1778; major, 1789; brigadier general, Ninth Brigade (upper part of Frederick County), Maryland Militia, 1794-1795 (resigned). **OUT OF STATE SERVICE:** sergeant-at-arms of the U.S. Senate, November 6, 1811-December 9, 1833. **WEALTH DURING LIFETIME.** **PERSONAL PROPERTY:** 10 slaves, 1790. **LAND AT FIRST ELECTION:** none found in Maryland; may have inherited his father's land in Virginia, 1782. **SIGNIFICANT CHANGES IN LAND BETWEEN FIRST ELECTION AND DEATH:** purchased 670 acres in Frederick County, including 347 acres of confiscated British property; sold 192 acres, including 5 lots (3 in Frederick Town, Frederick County), 1785-1805. Entitled to 200 acres in Allegany County for service during the Revolutionary War. **WEALTH AT DEATH.** DIED: in 1836; buried in the Congressional Cemetery, Washington, D.C. **LAND:** possibly ca. 478 acres in Frederick County.

BAYLY (BAILEY, BAYLEY), WILLIAM (ca. 1742-1824). BORN: ca. 1742 in Virginia; second son. **IMMIGRATED:** from Virginia, first generation. **RESIDED:** in Frederick County, 1773; Georgetown, Montgomery County, 1787; Prince George's County, 1788; St. Mary's County, 1809; Washington County, 1810. **FAMILY BACKGROUND.** FATHER: William Bayly (1715-1782), of Fairfax County, Virginia.
