

WEALTH AT DEATH. DIED: by late March 1725/26. **PERSONAL PROPERTY:** TEV, £1,957.8.0 (including 40 slaves and 4 servants); FB, £250.4.6. **LAND:** ca. 14,070 acres, of which 4,500 acres were jointly owned with *Daniel Dulany* (1685–1753).

BRADLEY (BRADLY), ISAAC (?–ca. 1795). **RESIDED:** in Caroline County, 1774; Sussex County, Delaware, by 1775. **FAMILY BACKGROUND. FATHER:** William Bradley (?–ca. 1784), of Dorchester County, who died in Delaware. **BROTHERS:** William (?–ca. 1814); Joseph (?–by 1814); and Jacob (?–ca. 1775), of Caroline County. **SISTERS:** Nancy (?–by 1784), who married Charles Brown; Mary, who married (first name unknown) Bannister; and Betty, who married (first name unknown) Freeny. **MARRIED** in March 1781 Elizabeth Casson (?–by 1798). **CHILDREN. SONS:** probably Henry; probably Joshua. **DAUGHTER:** Polly, who married (first name unknown) Wilson. **PRIVATE CAREER. EDUCATION:** literate. **SOCIAL STATUS AND ACTIVITIES:** Esq., by 1775. **PUBLIC CAREER. LEGISLATIVE SERVICE:** Convention, Caroline County, 1st, 1774. **OUT OF STATE SERVICE:** Council of Safety, Sussex County, Delaware, appointed 1775; Convention, Sussex County, Delaware, elected on August 19, 1776 (this convention met on September 11, 1776, for the purpose of “ordaining and declaring the future form of Government of that State.”); justice, Sussex County, Delaware, appointed 1784. **WEALTH AT DEATH. DIED:** ca. 1795 in Sussex County, Delaware. **LAND:** 100 acres in Caroline County; probably had land in Delaware as well.

BRADLEY, ROBERT (?–1724). **BORN:** probably in England. **IMMIGRATED:** by 1693 as a free adult. **RESIDED:** in Prince George’s County. **FAMILY BACKGROUND. BROTHER:** Benjamin Bradley, a merchant of London, England. **MARRIED** Sarah, (1677–?), daughter of *Richard Hall* (?–1688). Her brothers were *Elisha Hall* (1663–ca. 1716/17); Joseph (1665–1705); *Benjamin Hall* (1667–1721); and Aaron (1669–1704). Her sisters were Rachel (1671–1730), who married *Walter Smith* (?–1711); Elizabeth (1673–1743); and Lucia (1675–?), who married *John Smith* (?–1738). **CHILDREN. SON:** Robert, a justice of Prince George’s County from 1729 to 1731/32, who married (first name unknown), daughter of Clement Hill, nephew and heir of *Clement Hill* (?–1708). **PRIVATE CAREER. EDUCATION:** literate. **RELIGIOUS AFFILIATION:** Presbyterian. **SOCIAL STATUS AND ACTIVITIES:** he had important mercantile connections; he was prosecuted in 1694 for violating the Navigation Acts, but was acquitted. **OCCUPATIONAL PROFILE:** factor for Edward and Dudley Carleton, mer-

chants in England; merchant; shipowner. **PUBLIC CAREER. LEGISLATIVE SERVICE:** Lower House, Prince George’s County, 1701–1704 (Accounts 1–3, 5), 1706–1707 (elected to the 4th session), 1708A, 1708B–1711 (speaker, 1–4). **OTHER PROVINCIAL OFFICE:** justice, Provincial Court, 1709–1714. **LOCAL OFFICES:** justice, Prince George’s County, 1695/96–1709 (quorum, 1697–1709; chief justice, 1705–1709); coroner, Prince George’s County, 1696–1707; St. Paul’s Parish Vestry, Prince George’s County, 1704. **WEALTH DURING LIFETIME. LAND AT FIRST ELECTION:** at least 100 acres. **WEALTH AT DEATH. DIED:** in 1724. **PERSONAL PROPERTY:** gave all of his personal property to his son before his death. **LAND:** gave 870 acres to his son before his death.

BRADNOX (BRADNOCKS, BRODNOX), THOMAS (ca. 1599–1661). **BORN:** ca. 1599, probably in England. **IMMIGRATED:** on Kent Island, by 1637/38. **RESIDED:** in Kent County. **MARRIED** Mary (?–1674), who subsequently married ca. 1664 John Vicaris (?–ca. 1669), and finally, Francis Pine (?–by 1674). **CHILDREN:** Died without progeny. **PRIVATE CAREER. EDUCATION:** illiterate. **RELIGIOUS AFFILIATION:** Protestant. **SOCIAL STATUS AND ACTIVITIES:** in 1642 he had the third highest assessment of seventy-one men on Kent Island; Mr., by 1647/48; Gent., by 1652/53; usually owned at least two or three servants, whom he notoriously mistreated; he was one of the most disreputable men in the colony; raised Francis Mauldin (?–1710/11) for six years before Mauldin’s mother reclaimed him in 1659/60. **OCCUPATIONAL PROFILE:** planter. **PUBLIC CAREER. LEGISLATIVE SERVICE:** Assembly, Kent County, 1637/38, present 1647/48. **LOCAL OFFICES:** justice, Kent County, 1647–1653, 1658–1661; sheriff, Kent County, 1653. **MILITARY SERVICE:** commander’s mate, Kent County, 1641; captain and commander of all the forces on Kent Island, 1658. **WEALTH DURING LIFETIME. LAND AT FIRST ELECTION:** acquired with William Brantwell legal control over 2,000 acres in 1640; sold 200 acres in 1661. **WEALTH AT DEATH. DIED:** between October 20 and December 25, 1661. **PERSONAL PROPERTY:** no value given in his inventory; 4 servants; 3 horses, 64 hogs, 34 cattle. **LAND:** 1,900 acres.

BRAINTHWAITE, WILLIAM (?–ca. 1649/50). **BORN:** probably in England. **IMMIGRATED:** by 1637/38 as a free adult. **RESIDED:** in Kent County; St. Mary’s County, by 1643. **FAMILY BACKGROUND. FATHER:** probably Robert Braithwaite, secretary to Sir Richard Weston, who was proba-
