LEGISLATIVE SERVICE: Lower House, Calvert County, 1740-1741 (elected to the 1st session to fill vacancy), 1742-1744, 1745, 1745/46-1748. LOCAL OFFICES: sheriff, Calvert County, in office 1725; justice, Calvert County, 1731-at least 1736 (quorum, 1734-at least 1736); land commissioner, Calvert County, period of service unknown; trustee and visitor of a school, Calvert County, period of service unknown. MILITARY SERVICE: colonel, period of service unknown. WEALTH DUR-ING LIFETIME. LAND AT FIRST ELECTION: inherited part of his father's dwelling plantation and 1 other tract both of unspecified acreage, 1738/39. WEALTH AT DEATH, DIED: ca. September 1748 in Calvert County. PERSONAL PROPERTY: TEV, £73.12.4 sterling, £1,520.11.3 current money; FB, estate overpaid £116.4.4 sterling, £1,255.17.2 current money.

BROOKE, BAKER (1628-1678/79). BORN: in 1628 in England; first son. IMMIGRATED: in 1650 as a young adult with his father and siblings. RE-SIDED: in Calvert County. FAMILY BACKGROUND. FATHER: Robert Brooke (1602-1655). MOTHER: Mary (?-1634), daughter of Thomas Baker, Esq., a barrister; granddaughter of Sir Thomas Engham, of Goodneston, Kent, England. STEPMOTHER: Mary Mainwaring (?-1663). BROTHER: Thomas Brooke (1632-1676). HALF BROTHERS: Charles Brooke (1636-1671); Roger (1637-1700); Robert (1639–1667); John (1640–1677); William (1643–?); Francis (1648-1671); Basil (?-1651, died in infancy); and Henry (1655-1672). SISTERS: Mary (1630-by 1650); Barbara (1634-by 1650). HALF SISTERS: Mary (1642-?); Ann (1645-?); and Elizabeth (1655-?), who married Richard Smith (?-1714), son of Richard Smith (?-ca. 1690). MAR-RIED in 1664 Anne, daughter of Leonard Calvert (ca. 1606-1647); niece of Cecilius Calvert, 2nd Lord Baltimore (1605-1675). She subsequently married both Henry Brent (?-1693) and Richard Marsham (?-1713). Her brother was William Calvert (ca. 1642/43-1682). CHILDREN, SONS: Baker (?-1698), who married Catherine: Charles (?-1698); and Leonard (?-1718), who married Ann. daughter of William Boreman (ca. 1630-1709). DAUGHTER: Mary (?-1763), who married Raphael Neale (1683-1743), son of Anthony Neale. PRI-VATE CAREER. EDUCATION: literate; he probably had considerable schooling. RELIGIOUS AFFILIA-TION: Protestant, but he converted to Roman Catholicism, probably at the time of his marriage. SOCIAL STATUS AND ACTIVITIES: he was Maryland's first second generation councilor; his earliest offices came soon after his father's death; his religious conversion and marriage to the proprietor's niece reestablished the family as one of the most powerful in the colony. OCCUPATIONAL PRO-FILE: planter. PUBLIC CAREER. LEGISLATIVE SER-VICE: Upper House, special writ 1658, 1659/60, 1661, 1662, 1663–1664, 1666, 1669, 1671–1674/75 (Accounts 1, 2; Laws 1, 2), 1676-1678 (died before the 3rd session). OTHER PROVINCIAL OF-FICES: Council, 1658-1678/79; justice, Provincial Court, 1658-1678/79; deputy governor, 1669-1670; surveyor general, 1671-1678/79. WEALTH DURING LIFETIME. LAND AT FIRST ELECTION: owned 2,100 acres and controlled 4,000 acres of deceased father's land. WEALTH AT DEATH. DIED: will probated in March 1678/79. PERSONAL PROP-ERTY: TEV, 135,126 pounds of tobacco (equivalent to £709.8.2) (including 2 slaves, 5 servants, and books); FB, 109,582 pounds of tobacco. LAND: over 3,500 acres.

BROOKE, CHARLES (1636-1671). BORN: in 1636 in England; third son. IMMIGRATED: in 1650 as a minor with his father and siblings. RESIDED: in Calvert County. FAMILY BACKGROUND. FA-THER: Robert Brooke (1602-1655). MOTHER: Mary (?-1663), daughter of Roger Mainwaring, the dean of Worcester and bishop of St. David's. BROTH-ERS: Roger (1637-1700); Robert (1639-1667); John (1640-1677); William (1643-?); Francis (1648-1671); Basil (?-1651, died in infancy); and Henry (1655-1672). HALF BROTHERS: Baker Brooke (1628-1678/79); Thomas Brooke (1632-1676). SISTERS: Mary (1642-?); Ann (1645-?); and Elizabeth (1655-?), who married Richard Smith (?-1714), son of Richard Smith (?-ca. 1690). HALF SISTERS: Mary (1630-by 1650); Barbara (1634-by 1650). MARRIED never. CHILDREN. Died without progeny. PRIVATE CAREER. EDUCATION: literate; probably attended Harvard College and headed the class in 1651. RELIGIOUS AFFILIATION: probably a Protestant.
