**BROOKE, JOHN** (by 1646–1692/93). BORN: by 1646, probably in Yorkshire, England; only son. IMMIGRATED: in 1654 as a minor with his parents from Virginia. RESIDED: in Calvert County; Dorchester County by 1671. FAMILY BACKGROUND. FATHER: *Michael Brooke* (?–ca. 1663/64). STEPFATHER: *Henry Trippe* (1632–1697/98). MOTHER: Frances. MARRIED first, by 1679 Katherine, widow of Robert Stevens. MARRIED second, Judith (?–1693). CHILDREN. DAUGHTERS: Mary, who married *Joseph Ennalls* (?–1709); Ann, who married first, *Thomas Cooke* (?–1692/93), and second, John Stevens, son of *John Stevens* (?–1692). PRIVATE CAREER. EDUCATION: literate. RELIGIOUS AFFILIATION: Protestant. SOCIAL STATUS AND ACTIVITIES: second generation burgess. OCCUPATIONAL PROFILE: physician; planter. PUBLIC CAREER. LEGISLATIVE SERVICE: Lower House, Dorchester County, 1681–1682 (elected to the 3rd session), 1682–1684, 1686–1688; Associators' Convention, Dorchester County, 1689–1692; Grand Committee of Twenty, 1690–1692; Lower House, Dorchester County, 1692 (died before the 2nd session). OTHER PROVINCIAL OFFICE: justice, Provincial Court, 1691–1692. LOCAL OFFICES: justice, Dorchester County, 1671–1674, 1676–1693 (quorum, 1679–1693); town officer of Yarmouth, Dorchester County, 1686; deputy commissary, Dorchester County, 1692. STANDS ON PUBLIC/PRIVATE ISSUES: supported the Protestant Associators' revolution of 1689. WEALTH DURING LIFETIME. LAND AT FIRST ELECTION: over 500 acres. WEALTH AT DEATH. DIED: between January 24 and March 21, 1692/93. LAND: 850 acres, plus 2 tracts of unspecified acreage.

**BROOKE, MICHAEL** (?–ca. 1663/64). BORN: in Yorkshire, England. IMMIGRATED: in 1654 as a free adult with his wife and son from Virginia. RESIDED: in Calvert County. FAMILY BACKGROUND. FATHER: John Brooke, of Yorkshire, England. MARRIED Frances, who subsequently married in 1665 *Henry Trippe* (1632–1697/98). CHILDREN. SON: *John Brooke* (by 1646–1692/93), who married first, Katherine, widow of Robert Stevens, and second, Judith (?–1693). PRIVATE CAREER. EDUCATION: literate. RELIGIOUS AFFILIATION: Protestant, probably a Puritan. SOCIAL STATUS AND ACTIVITIES: transported two servants on his arrival; Mr., 1655. OCCUPATIONAL PROFILE: attorney, 1657/58; planter. PUBLIC CAREER. LEGISLATIVE SERVICE: Parliamentary Commission, 1655–

1657/58; Assembly, Patuxent (Calvert County), 1657; Lower House, Calvert County, 1658, 1659/60. OTHER PROVINCIAL OFFICES: justice, Provincial Court, 1655–1657/58. LOCAL OFFICE: justice, Patuxent (Calvert County), 1655–1661. STANDS ON PUBLIC/PRIVATE ISSUES: his religious beliefs probably accounted for his move from Virginia and his immediate assumption of high office under the Puritan government of Maryland, 1654; he probably supported Fendall's Rebellion, 1659/60–1660, and lost his justiceship as a consequence. WEALTH DURING LIFETIME. LAND AT FIRST ELECTION: rights to 200 acres; 350 acres by 1662. WEALTH AT DEATH. DIED: by February 2, 1663/64. PERSONAL PROPERTY: TEV, 21,015 pounds of tobacco. LAND: 500–1,000 acres.

**BROOKE, RICHARD** (1716–1783). BORN: on June 2, 1716, in Prince George's County; fourth son. NATIVE: fifth generation. RESIDED: at "Brookfield," Prince George's County. FAMILY BACKGROUND. FATHER: *Thomas Brooke* (1683–1744). MOTHER: Lucy, daughter of *Walter Smith* (?–1711). AUNTS: Ann Smith (1694–1759), who married second, *Thomas Trueman Greenfield* (1682–1733); Elinor Smith, who married *Thomas Addison* (1679–1727); Rebecca Smith, who married *Daniel Dulany* (1685–1753); Sarah Brooke (?–1724), who married first, *William Dent* (ca. 1660–1704), and second, *Philip Lee* (ca. 1681–1744); and Priscilla Brooke, who married *Thomas Gantt* (?–1765). BROTHERS: Thomas (1706–1749); Walter (1707–1740/41); Nathaniel (1712–?); Isaac (1722–1756); Daniel (1726–1735); Charles (1727–1727); Robert (1728–1777); and Rev. Clement (1730–1800). SISTERS: Mary (1709–?); Anna (1711–?); Lucy (1714–1718); Eleanor (1718–?), who married ca. 1734 Col. *Samuel Beall* (ca. 1713–ca. 1778); Rachel (1719–1789); Lucy (1721–?); Rebecca (1722–?); and Elizabeth (1724–1794). FIRST COUSINS: *John Addison* (1713–1764); Ann Addison (1711/12–?), who married *William Murdock* (?–1769); *Richard Lee* (ca. 1707–1787); *Arthur Lee* (?–1760); *Francis Lee* (?–1749); *Daniel Dulany, Jr.* (1722–1797); *Walter Dulany* (?–1773); Margaret Dulany, who married first, *Alexander Hamilton* (1712–1756), and second, *William Murdock* (?–1769); Marianne Greenfield, who married *John Stoddert* (?–1767); *Thomas Gantt* (ca. 1710–1785); *Fielder Gantt* (?–1807); *Edward Gantt* (?–by 1783); and probably Ann Gantt, who married *John Brome* (1703–1748).
