Her brothers were *Richard*; *John* (?-1754); *Roger*; *Henry Hooper* (ca. 1687-1767); *Thomas*; and *James* (1703-1789). Her sisters were *Mary* (1674-1745), who married *Henry Ennalls* (1675-1734); *Priscilla*; *Elizabeth*, who married *Matthew Travers* (ca. 1672-1742); *Rebecca*; *Mary* (?-ca. 1757), who married second, *John Rider* (1686-1739/40); *Rosannah*; and *Sarah*. CHILDREN. SONS: *John Brome* (1703-1748), who probably married *Ann*, daughter of *Thomas Gantt* (?-1765); *Henry*; and *Thomas*. DAUGHTERS: *Ann*, who married (first name unknown) *Travers*; *Mary* (1707-?); *Margaret*, who married *Daniel Rawlings*; *Elizabeth*, who married *Joshua Sedgewick*; and *Sarah*, who married *Samuel Askcom*. PRIVATE CAREER. EDUCATION: literate. RELIGIOUS AFFILIATION: Anglican. OCCUPATIONAL PROFILE: planter. PUBLIC CAREER. BROUGHE, WILLIAM (?-1651). BORN: in England or Holland. IMMIGRATED: in 1636 as a free adult. RESIDED: in St. Mary's County. MARRIED *Sarah*, who subsequently married in 1652 *William Scott*. CHILDREN. Died without progeny. PRIVATE CAREER. EDUCATION: probably literate. RELIGIOUS AFFILIATION: Protestant. SOCIAL STATUS AND ACTIVITIES: low to middling social status; acquired land by 1642; held no titles; made a trip to Holland shortly before his death. OCCUPATIONAL PROFILE: planter. PUBLIC CAREER. LEGISLATIVE SERVICE: Assembly, present 1637/38, St. Clement's Hundred, St. Mary's County, 1642A, present 1642B; Lower House, Newtown Hundred, St. Mary's County, 1650-1650/51 (Accounts 1). WEALTH DURING LIFETIME. LAND: 200 acres, which he sold before his death. WEALTH AT DEATH. DIED: will probated on December 5, 1651. PERSONAL PROPERTY: TEV, 6,704 pounds of tobacco.

BROWN, EDWARD (?-1716). BORN: probably in Kent County. NATIVE: probably second or third generation. RESIDED: in Kent County; "of Kent Island," Queen Anne's County, by 1707. FAMILY BACKGROUND. FATHER: probably either *Edward Brown*, who immigrated as a servant in 1655, married in 1668 *Sarah*, daughter of *Morgan Williams* (?-1685), and served as constable of Upper Hundred of Kent Island from 1669/70 to 1670; or *Morgan Brown* (1669-by 1705), son of *Edward Brown*. MARRIED *Mary*. CHILDREN. SONS: *John* (?-1723), who married *Catherine*; *Matthew*. DAUGHTERS: *Mary*; *Rachel*; and *Sarah*. PRIVATE CAREER. EDUCATION: literate. RELIGIOUS AFFILIATION: Protestant. SOCIAL STATUS AND ACTIVITIES: Mr., 1706; Gent., 1715. OCCUPATIONAL PROFILE: planter. PUBLIC CAREER. LEGISLATIVE SERVICE: Lower House, Queen Anne's County, 1715. LOCAL OFFICE: justice, Queen Anne's County, 1715/16 (quorum). WEALTH AT DEATH. DIED: will probated on June 9, 1716. PERSONAL PROPERTY: TEV, £413.16.4 current money (including 4 slaves and 1 servant); FB, £344.4.9.

BROWN, JAMES (?-1770). NATIVE: probably, if so second generation. RESIDED: in Dorchester County. FAMILY BACKGROUND. FATHER: *Thomas Brown* (?-ca. 1713), of Dorchester County. STEP-FATHER: *Thomas Smith* (?-1727), of Dorchester County. MOTHER: *Roseannah*. BROTHERS: *John* (?-1767), who married *Mary Anderton*; *Thomas*; and *Charles*. MARRIED by 1713 *Sarah*, widow of *William Clarkson* (?-1706), of Dorchester County, planter. CHILDREN. SONS: *John* (?-1768); *Thomas* (?-by 1769), who married *Elizabeth*; and *James, Jr.*, who married *Sarah*. STEPSONS: *William Clarkson*; *Thomas Clarkson*, who married *Mary*; *Robert Clarkson*; and *Richard Clarkson*. DAUGHTERS: *Mary* (?-ca. 1769), who married *Edward Newton*; (first name unknown), who married (first name unknown) *Handley*; *Sarah*, who married *John Edwards*; and *Margery* (?-by 1761), who married first, *Thomas Kennerly*, second, *Benjamin Wheland*, and third, *John Gibbs*. OTHER CHILDREN: a stepchild, (first name and sex unknown) *Clarkson*. PRIVATE CAREER. EDUCATION: literate. SOCIAL STATUS AND ACTIVITIES: Gent., 1728.
