SISTER: Elizabeth. HALF FIRST COUSINS: Richard Brooke (1736-1788); Richard Thomas (ca. 1728-1806); and Evan Thomas (1738/39-1826). OTHER KINSHIP his great-uncle was Philip Thomas (1693/94-1762). MARRIED Elizabeth Ridgely (1764-1828), daughter of Charles Greenbury Griffith (1744–1792). CHILDREN, SONS: Charles Henry: Richard. LAND AT FIRST ELECTION: at least 2,435 acres, possibly as much as 3,035 acres in Frederick County (later became part of Montgomery County) (600 acres inherited from his father). SIGNIFICANT CHANGES IN LAND BETWEEN FIRST ELECTION AND DEATH: acquired an additional 1,598 acres in Montgomery County, of which 1,200 acres were his wife's inheritance, 1792-1800; sold 1,429 acres in Montgomery County, of which 1,131 acres were his wife's land, 1793-1798.
