Her nephew was *John Hammond Dorsey* (1718–1774). **CHILDREN.** Three, sex and names unknown, all died young. **PRIVATE CAREER.** **EDUCATION:** literate. **RELIGIOUS AFFILIATION:** Anglican. **SOCIAL STATUS AND ACTIVITIES:** second generation burgess and councilor; closely related to several important Maryland families. **OCCUPATIONAL PROFILE:** planter; merchant. **PUBLIC CAREER.** **LEGISLATIVE SERVICE:** Lower House, Anne Arundel County, 1701/2–1704 (elected to the 2nd session; Aggravances 5), 1704–1707 (Laws 1–5, chairman 4), 1708A (Laws, probably chairman), 1708B (Laws, chairman 1; appointed to Council after the 1st session of 1708B–1711 Assembly); Upper House, 1709–1711 (appointed before the 2nd session), 1712–1713 (died before the 3rd session). **OTHER PROVINCIAL OFFICES:** Council, 1708–1713; associate justice, Court of Chancery, 1709–1713. **LOCAL OFFICES:** justice, Anne Arundel County 1702–1709 (quorum); St. Margaret's Parish Vestry, Anne Arundel County, 1707. **MILITARY SERVICE:** major, 1701/2–1707; colonel, 1707. **WEALTH DURING LIFETIME.** **LAND AT FIRST ELECTION:** at least 615 acres. **WEALTH AT DEATH.** **DIED:** on November 19, 1713. **PERSONAL PROPERTY:** TEV, £1,474.14.11 sterling (including 16 slaves). **LAND:** probably ca. 615 acres.

GREENBERRY (GREENBURY), NICHOLAS (1627–1697). **BORN:** in 1627 in England. **IMMIGRATED:** in 1674 as a free adult with his wife and two children. **RESIDED:** in Anne Arundel County. **MARRIED** Ann (1648–1698). **CHILDREN.** **SON:** *Charles Greenberry* (1672–1713), who married Rachel (?–1748/49), daughter of John Stimpson. **DAUGHTERS:** Katherine, who married first, Henry Ridgeley (1669–1699/1700), son of *Henry Ridgeley* (?–1710), and second, John Howard; Ann, who married *John Hammond* (ca. 1665–1742/43); and Elizabeth (1678–1719/20), who married in 1697 *Robert Goldsborough* (1660–1746). **PRIVATE CAREER.** **EDUCATION:** literate. **RELIGIOUS AFFILIATION:** Protestant. **SOCIAL STATUS AND ACTIVITIES:** immigrated with three servants; Gent. on arrival. **OCCUPATIONAL PROFILE:** planter; merchant. **PUBLIC CAREER.** **LEGISLATIVE SERVICE:** Associators' Convention, Anne Arundel County, 1690–1692 (elected to the 2nd or 3rd session); Grand Committee of Twenty, 1690–1692; Upper House, 1692–1693 (Laws 1), 1694–1697. **OTHER PROVINCIAL OFFICES:** Council, 1691–1697 (president, 1693–1694); justice, Provincial Court, 1691–1694 (quorum); chancellor, 1693/94–1694. **LOCAL OF-**

FICE: justice, Anne Arundel County, 1686–1692 (quorum, 1689–1692). **MILITARY SERVICE:** captain, 1686–1687, 1689–1691; major, 1691–1692; colonel, 1692–1697. **STANDS ON PUBLIC/PRIVATE ISSUES:** his initial attitude toward the revolution of 1689 is uncertain, but he supported the new government by the late spring of 1690 and he rose rapidly in colonial politics after the revolution; his appointment as president of the Council, and thus acting chief executive, by Edmund Andros in 1693, was strongly opposed by Sir Thomas Lawrence. **WEALTH DURING LIFETIME.** **LAND AT FIRST ELECTION:** over 700 acres. **WEALTH AT DEATH.** **DIED:** on December 17, 1697. **PERSONAL PROPERTY:** TEV, £1,045.15.3 sterling (including 6 slaves and 1 servant); FB, £903.5.8, cash balance in England of £363.12.4. **LAND:** ca. 700 acres.

GREENE, LEONARD (?–1688). **BORN:** in St. Mary's County; probably second son. **NATIVE:** second generation. **RESIDED:** in St. Mary's County. **FAMILY BACKGROUND.** **FATHER:** *Thomas Greene* (?–ca. 1651/52). **MOTHER:** probably Winifred, widow of Nicholas Harvey. She subsequently married *Robert Clarke* (ca. 1611–1664). **BROTHERS:** Thomas; Robert, who married Mary, daughter of *William Boreman* (ca. 1630–1709); and Francis. **MARRIED** Anne. **CHILDREN.** **SON:** Thomas. **DAUGHTERS:** Winifred, who married Francis Wheeler; Mary, who married Francis Marbury; and Margaret, who married Joseph Alvey. **PRIVATE CAREER.** **EDUCATION:** literate. **RELIGIOUS AFFILIATION:** Catholic. **SOCIAL STATUS AND ACTIVITIES:** second generation burgess; godson of Gov. Leonard Calvert. **OCCUPATIONAL PROFILE:** planter; possibly also mercantile activity. **PUBLIC CAREER.** **LEGISLATIVE SERVICE:** Lower House, St. Mary's City, 1682–1684. **LOCAL OFFICES:** constable, St. George's Hundred, St. Mary's County, 1676; deputy sheriff, St. Mary's County, 1679. **WEALTH AT DEATH.** **DIED:** will probated on July 4, 1688. **PERSONAL PROPERTY:** TEV, £238.12.7 sterling (including 1 slave and 3 servants). **LAND:** 1,300 acres.

GREENE, THOMAS (?–ca. 1651/52). **BORN:** in England. **IMMIGRATED:** in 1633/34 as a free adult. **RESIDED:** in St. Mary's County. **FAMILY BACKGROUND.** **BROTHER:** Robert, Esq. **MARRIED** first, Ann Cox. **MARRIED** second, in 1643 Millicent Browne. **MARRIED** third, by 1647 Winifred Seyborn, widow of Nicholas Harvey. She subsequently married *Robert Clarke* (ca. 1611–1664). **CHILDREN.** **SONS:** Thomas; *Leonard Greene* (?–1688), who married Ann; Robert, who married Mary, daughter of *William Boreman* (ca. 1630–
