DIED:** will probated on September 13, 1785, in Prince George's County. **PERSONAL PROPERTY:** TEV, £2,210.2.5 (including 29 slaves and books); FB, estate overpaid £349.5.3. **LAND:** 547 acres in Prince George's County, plus unspecified acreage in Pennsylvania. **ADDITIONAL COMMENTS:** After his death claims against his estate totaled £4,500. His land was sold to pay his creditors.

HAWKINS, HENRY (?-1699). **IMMIGRATED:** in 1665 as a free adult with his wife and son. **RESIDED:** in Talbot County; Port Tobacco Hundred, Charles County, by 1671. **MARRIED** first, Eleanor (?-by 1681). **MARRIED** second, Elizabeth, widow of Francis Wynn. Her niece was Elizabeth Teares, who married *William Middleton* (1686-1769). **CHILDREN. SONS:** John; Henry (ca. 1667-1702), who married Susan, daughter of Alexander Smith; *Henry Holland Hawkins* (1683-1751), who married Jane, daughter of *Thomas Greenfield* (ca. 1649-1715). **DAUGHTERS:** Ruth, who married James Rooch; Mary; and Eleanor, who married first, Rev. George Tubman, and second, William Smallwood, son of *James Smallwood* (ca. 1639-ca. 1714/15). **PRIVATE CAREER. EDUCATION:** literate. **RELIGIOUS AFFILIATION:** Anglican. **SOCIAL STATUS AND ACTIVITIES:** Mr., by 1669. **OCCUPATIONAL PROFILE:** tanner; planter. **PUBLIC CAREER. LEGISLATIVE SERVICE:** Lower House, Charles County, 1688 (elected to the 2nd session); Associates' Convention, Charles County, 1689-1692; Lower House, Charles County, 1692-1693, 1694-1697, 1697/98-1698 (Elections and Privileges 1; died before the 3rd session). **LOCAL OFFICES:** constable, Charles County, 1670/71-1672; justice, Charles County, 1680-1699 (quorum, 1690-1699); Port Tobacco Parish Vestry, Charles County, 1693-1697. **MILITARY SERVICE:** captain, 1694. **STANDS ON PUBLIC/PRIVATE ISSUES:** initially hesitant to support the revolution of 1689. **WEALTH DURING LIFETIME. LAND AT FIRST ELECTION:** ca. 2,000 acres; his wife Elizabeth held 2,264 acres from her previous husband's estate. **WEALTH AT DEATH. DIED:** will probated on May 12, 1699. **PERSONAL PROPERTY:** TEV, £327.18.8 sterling (including 3 slaves and 11 servants). **LAND:** 2,775 acres.

HAWKINS, HENRY HOLLAND (1683-1751). **BORN:** in 1683 in Charles County; youngest son. **NATIVE:** second generation. **RESIDED:** at "Hawkins Purchase," Charles County. **FAMILY BACKGROUND. FATHER:** *Henry Hawkins* (?-1699).

MOTHER: Elizabeth. **BROTHERS:** John; Henry (ca. 1667-1702). **SISTERS:** Ruth; Mary; and Eleanor. **MARRIED** Jane, daughter of *Thomas Greenfield* (ca. 1649-1715); niece of Mary Truman, who married *Thomas Hollyday* (ca. 1661-1702/3); half niece of *Adderton Skinner* (ca. 1677-1756); step-niece of *Robert Skinner* (?-1713). Her brothers were *Thomas Trueman Greenfield* (1682-1733); Micajah; Truman; and James. Her sisters were Martha; Elizabeth; and Ann. Her first cousin was *James Hollyday* (1696-1747). Her nephew was *Francis Waring* (1715-1769). Her niece was Marianne Truman Greenfield, who married *John Stoddert* (?-1767). **CHILDREN. SONS:** Samuel; *Josias Hawkins* (ca. 1735-1789); and Henry. **DAUGHTERS:** Elizabeth, who married Richard Marsham Waring, Sr.; Martha, who married (first name unknown) Portase (Porteus); Eleanor, who married *George Dent* (?-1785); Jane; Susannah; and Ruth. **PRIVATE CAREER. EDUCATION:** literate. **RELIGIOUS AFFILIATION:** Protestant; his son-in-law, Richard Marsham Waring, Sr., specified in his will that his children remain with their mother, Elizabeth Hawkins, and "be educated in the Catholic church." **SOCIAL STATUS AND ACTIVITIES:** Gent., 1727; Mr., 1751. **OCCUPATIONAL PROFILE:** planter. **PUBLIC CAREER. LEGISLATIVE SERVICE:** Lower House, Charles County, 1722-1724, 1725-1727, 1732-1734, 1734/35-1737. **LOCAL OFFICE:** justice, Charles County, 1728-at least 1740 (quorum, 1735-at least 1740). **WEALTH DURING LIFETIME. LAND AT FIRST ELECTION:** at least 300 acres in Charles County (devised to him by his father, 1699). **SIGNIFICANT CHANGES IN LAND BETWEEN FIRST ELECTION AND DEATH:** purchased 1,459 acres in Charles County, 1735-1751; obtained at least 173 acres in Charles County, through his marriage. **WEALTH AT DEATH. DIED:** will probated on April 22, 1751, in Charles County. **PERSONAL PROPERTY:** TEV, £2,203.8.3 current money (including 36 slaves, books, and 55 oz. plate); FB, £2,115.4.0. **LAND:** at least 2,757 acres in Charles County.

HAWKINS, JOHN (ca. 1657-1717). **BORN:** ca. 1657 in Talbot County; second son. **NATIVE:** second generation. **RESIDED:** in Talbot County; Kent County, by 1696; Queen Anne's County, after 1707. **FAMILY BACKGROUND. FATHER:** almost certainly Thomas Hawkins (?-1656), who immigrated by 1656 from Westmoreland County, Virginia. **STEPFATHER:** by 1658, Seth Foster (?-1675). **MOTHER:** Elizabeth. **BROTHER:** Thomas (1645-1677). **HALF SISTERS:** Elizabeth (1658/59-1726), who married first, *Vincent Lowe* (?-1692), and sec-
