

Elizabeth Tilghman, who married *James Lloyd* (1745–1820); Anna Maria Robins (1732–1806), who married *Henry Hollyday* (ca. 1725–1789); Margaret Robins (1734–1808), who married *William Hayward* (?–1791); and Henrietta Maria Robins (1736–1791), who married *James Lloyd Chamberlaine* (1732–1783). Her nephew was *Thomas Ringgold* (1744–1776). MARRIED second, Sarah (1749–1794), daughter of *Alexander Williamson* (ca. 1712–1760); niece of *Thomas Ringgold* (1715–1772). Her brothers were Alexander (?–1760); James. Her sisters were Ann; Henrietta; and Rebecca. Her first cousin was *Thomas Ringgold* (1744–1776). MARRIED third, his first cousin Anna Maria (?–1817), who moved to Philadelphia after William's death and died there without progeny, daughter of *James Tilghman* (1716–1793); granddaughter of both *Richard Tilghman* (1672/73–1738/39) and *Tench Francis* (1701–1758); niece of *William Tilghman* (1711–1782), *Edward Tilghman* (1713–1786), *Matthew Tilghman* (1717/18–1790), Mary Tilghman (1702–ca. 1736), who married *James Earle, Jr.* (ca. 1694–1739), Henrietta Maria Tilghman (1707–1771), who married first, *George Robins* (1697–1742), and second, *William Goldsborough* (1709–1760), Anna Maria Tilghman (1709–1763), who married first, *William Hemsley* (1703–1736), and second, *Robert Lloyd* (ca. 1712–1770). Her brothers were Tench (1744–1786); Richard (1746–1796); *James Tilghman, Jr.* (ca. 1748–1796); *William Tilghman* (1756–1827); Philemon (1760–1797); and Thomas Ringgold (1765–1789). Her sisters were Elizabeth, who married *James Lloyd* (1745–1820); Mary; and Henrietta Maria (1763–1796). Her first cousins were *Michael Earle* (1722–1787); *Richard Tilghman Earle* (1728/29–1788); *Richard Tilghman* (1740–1809); *Matthew Tilghman* (1760–ca. 1801); *James Tilghman* (1743–1809); *Peregrine Tilghman* (ca. 1741–1807); Anna Maria Earle (1725–1795), who married *Thomas Ringgold* (1715–1772); Henrietta Maria Earle (1730–1767), who married *William Hemsley* (1736/37–1812); Deborah Lloyd, who married *Peregrine Tilghman* (ca. 1741–1807); Margaret Tilghman (1742–1817), who married *Charles Carroll, Barrister* (1723–1783); Anna Maria Robins (1732–1806), who married *Henry Hollyday* (ca. 1725–1789); Margaret Robins (1734–1808), who married *William Hayward* (?–1791); and Henrietta Maria Robins (1736–1791), who married *James Lloyd Chamberlaine* (1732–1783). 1808), daughter of *James Lloyd* (1745–1820), and second, in 1813 Ann, daughter of Daniel Fidde-man; Thomas, who married in 1808 Elizabeth (1783–1839), daughter of *James Tilghman, Jr.* (ca. 1748–1796); Alexander, who married first, in 1808 Henrietta Maria (?–1817), daughter of Lloyd Tilghman, and second, Elizabeth Ann, daughter of Francis West, of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, and wife Mary Nixon; and James, who never married. DAUGHTERS: Mary (1760–1798), buried at "Cloverfields," Queen Anne's County, who married ca. 1782 Joseph Forman, of Chestertown, Kent County; Charlotte (1762–1822), who never married; Anna Maria (?–died young); Sarah, who married Dr. John Irvine Troup; Henrietta Maria (1779–1821), died without progeny, who married Thomas Chamberlaine Earle (1771–?), son of *Richard Tilghman Earle* (1728/29–1788); Anna Maria, who married in 1805 Thomas Emory, of "Poplar Grove," Queen Anne's County; and Juliana, who never married. SOCIAL STATUS AND ACTIVITIES: Gent., 1759; Esq. at death; one of the five largest subscribers to the endowment of Washington College, Chestertown, Kent County, 1782. OCCUPATIONAL PROFILE: planter; owned two mills, one of which was Wye Mills in Talbot County valued at £450 in 1804; owned a privateer during the Revolution. PUBLIC CAREER. LEGISLATIVE SERVICE: Lower House, Queen Anne's County, 1778 (elected to the 2nd session of the 1777–1778 Assembly, but did not attend); Senate, Eastern Shore, Term of 1776–1781: 1779–1780 (elected on November 9, 1779, to fill vacancy; qualified on November 13, 1779), 1780–1781, Term of 1781–1786: 1784 (elected on December 4, 1784, to fill vacancy; declined to serve on December 9, 1784), Term of 1786–1791: 1786–1787, 1787–1788, 1788 (did not serve), 1789 (did not serve), 1790. OTHER PROVINCIAL/STATE OFFICES: treasurer, Eastern Shore, commissioned 1769 and 1773; 5th Council of Safety, Eastern Shore, 1776–1777 (appointed on December 13, 1776, but declined to serve); Executive Council, 1777 (elected on November 25, 1777, to fill vacancy, but declined to serve); Constitution Ratification Convention, Queen Anne's County, 1788. LOCAL OFFICES: St. Paul's Church Vestry, St. Paul's Parish, Queen Anne's County, in office 1760–1763, 1766–1768, 1772–1779, 1789–1792; churchwarden, St. Paul's Church, St. Paul's Parish, Queen Anne's County, in office 1771; appointed by the Council of Safety to purchase gold and silver coin in Queen Anne's County "to en-
