

The members of all first session Lower House standing committees were reappointed to continue in the convention, and the second, third, and fourth sessions. The only names actually relisted, however, were the members on the Committee of Bills of Credit in the convention, and the second and third sessions.

² This joint committee is referred to in the Lower House as the "Committee to inspect the accounts and proceedings of the Commissioners for emitting Bills of Credit," and in the Upper House as "the Committee to inspect the proceedings of the Commissioners of the paper currency." It originated on March 21, 1734/35. No Upper House member was named to this committee during the fourth session.
