

tion of individual names. The second, much less common, occurrence is where the journal contains no indication of any appointments or reappointments to obviously functioning standing committees. In these cases legislators named in the last complete committee listing are credited with continuing service.

All committees on the session lists are Lower House committees, unless otherwise noted as a joint committee. Joint committee membership lists are presented with Upper House (or Senate) members first, followed by Lower House members.
