

PROFILE: planter. **PUBLIC CAREER. LEGISLATIVE SERVICE:** Lower House, Prince George's County, 1734/35–1737 (Bills of Credit 3, 4), 1738 (Bills of Credit), 1745/46–1748 (Aggravances Cv 1, 1–3, 4; Bills of Credit Cv 1, 1–3, 4), Charles County, 1749–1751 (Elections Cv–3; Aggravances Cv–3), 1751–1754 (Elections 1–6; Grievances 1–6; Accounts 3–6), 1754–1757 (Elections 1–6; Grievances 1–6; Accounts 1–6). **LOCAL OFFICE:** justice, Charles County, commissioned 1749. **MILITARY SERVICE:** captain of a company of foot soldiers that was originally part of the Prince George's County Militia but was later annexed to Charles County, by 1748. **WEALTH DURING LIFETIME. PERSONAL PROPERTY:** bought 2 slaves, 1735. **LAND AT FIRST ELECTION:** 4,381 acres in Charles and Frederick counties (inherited 3,272 acres from father and brother; patented 1,109 acres). **SIGNIFICANT CHANGES IN LAND BETWEEN FIRST ELECTION AND DEATH:** acquired by inheritance and probable purchase 2,407 acres in Charles and Frederick counties, 1736–1753; sold 2,206 acres in Charles County, 1733–1767. **WEALTH AT DEATH. DIED:** between May 6 and May 18, 1767, in Charles County. **PERSONAL PROPERTY:** TEV, £1,599.4.2 as calculated (including 17 slaves, 115 books of which 48 were old Latin books, and a parcel of other old books); FB, £1,483.10.1. **LAND:** 4,582 acres in Charles and Frederick counties.

STODDERT, JOHN TRUMAN (1732–1765). BORN: on July 18, 1732, in Prince George's (later became Charles) County; second of seven sons. NATIVE: third generation. RESIDED: on 500 acres of the tract "Southampton Enlarged" on the Potomac River at Pomonkey Creek in Charles County. **FAMILY BACKGROUND. FATHER:** *John Stoddert* (?–1767), son of *James Stoddert* (ca. 1667–1726). **MOTHER:** Marianne, daughter of *Thomas Trueman Greenfield* (1682–1733). **HALF UNCLE:** *Thomas Hanson Marshall* (1731–1801). **HALFAUNT:** Sarah Marshall (1735–1795), who married in 1752 *John Dent, of George* (ca. 1733–1809). **BROTHERS:** James Truman (1728–?); Thomas Truman (1733/34–?); William Truman (1736/37–1770); Kenhelm Truman (1739–?); Richard Truman (1741/42–1769); and Walter Truman (1747–1772), who married Margaret, daughter of *Bayne Smallwood* (ca. 1711–1768). **SISTERS:** Mary Truman (1744–?); Marianne Truman. **FIRST COUSINS:** *Benjamin Stoddert* (ca. 1751–1813); Anne Truman Greenfield, who married in 1768, *Patrick Sim Smith* (1749–ca. 1793). **MARRIED** Lucy Heabard (?–1768), daughter of *Bayne Smallwood* (ca. 1711–

1768) and wife Priscilla Heabard (?–1784). Her brothers were *William Smallwood* (1732–1792); Heabard (?–1780). Her sisters were Elizabeth; Eleanor; Priscilla Heabard; and Margaret, who married Walter Truman, son of *James Stoddert* (ca. 1667–1726). **CHILDREN. SONS:** William Truman (?–1793), who married Sally, who subsequently married second, Alexander Greer. **PRIVATE CAREER. EDUCATION:** probably literate. **RELIGIOUS AFFILIATION:** Protestant. **SOCIAL STATUS AND ACTIVITIES:** Mr., by 1765; Gent., by 1766. **OCCUPATIONAL PROFILE:** probably planter. **PUBLIC CAREER. LEGISLATIVE SERVICE:** Lower House, Charles County, 1757–1758, 1758–1761 (Bills of Credit 2, 3, Cv 3; Arms and Ammunition 3, Cv 3), 1762–1763 (Bills of Credit 1, 2), 1765 (elected to the 1765–1766 Assembly, but did not attend; died before the first session). **WEALTH DURING LIFETIME. LAND AT FIRST ELECTION:** Stoddert lived on a 500-acre tract in Charles county given to him by his father, but title to the tract was never legally conveyed to him by his father. **WEALTH AT DEATH. DIED:** in January 1765 in Charles County. **PERSONAL PROPERTY:** TEV, £1,049.9.10 current money (including 18 slaves, 8 books, and a parcel of small books); FB, £811.8.11. **LAND:** no evidence of land owned in his own right.

STONE, JOHN (ca. 1648–1697). BORN: ca. 1648, in Virginia; probably third son. IMMIGRATED: in 1648 or 1649, as a minor with his parents from Virginia. RESIDED: in Charles County by 1670. **FAMILY BACKGROUND. FATHER:** *William Stone* (ca. 1603–ca. 1659/60). **MOTHER:** Verlinda Graves. **BROTHERS:** Thomas (ca. 1635–1676); Richard (?–1667); and Matthew (?–1676). **SISTERS:** Elizabeth, who married *William Calvert* (ca. 1642/43–1682); Mary; and Catherine. **NEPHEW:** *William Stone* (1666–1731). **MARRIED** first, Elizabeth, possibly the daughter of Thomas Warren. **MARRIED** second, name unknown. **MARRIED** third, by 1684, Elinor (1667–?), daughter of *Walter Bayne* (?–1670). Her brother was *John Bayne* (ca. 1662–1701). Her niece was Anne Bayne, who married *Thomas Dent* (1685–1725). Elinor married second, in 1698, Hugh Tears (?–1699/1700), and third, *John Beale, of Lawson* (ca. 1674–1751). **CHILDREN. SONS:** *Thomas Stone* (1677–1727); John (?–1703); Matthew (ca. 1679–1750), who married Rachel, daughter of Thomas Smoot; and Walter. **DAUGHTERS:** Elinor; Elizabeth. **PRIVATE CAREER. EDUCATION:** literate. **RELIGIOUS AFFILIATION:** Anglican. **SOCIAL STATUS AND ACTIVITIES:** second generation provincial officeholder; not of age in
