Deborah was the granddaughter of **James Lloyd** (1679/80–1723) and **Richard Tilghman** (1672/73–1738/39). She was the niece of **Edward Tilghman** (1713–1786); **James Tilghman** (1716–1793); **William Tilghman** (1711–1782); **Matthew Tilghman** (1717/18–1790); Henrietta Maria Lloyd (ca. 1711–1748), who married **Samuel Chamberlaine** (1698–1773); Margaret Lloyd (1714–ca. 1785), who married **William Tilghman** (1711–1782); Anne Lloyd (ca. 1723–1794), who married **Matthew Tilghman** (1717/18–1790); Mary Tilghman (1702–ca. 1736), who married **James Earle, Jr.** (ca. 1694–1739); and Henrietta Maria Tilghman (1707–1771), who married first, **George Robins** (1697–1742), and second, **William Goldsborough** (1709–1760). Her brother was Richard (?–died young). Her half brother was **William Hemsley** (1736/37–1812). Her sister was Anna Maria. LEGISLATIVE SERVICE: Conventions, Talbot County, 4th, 1775, 5th, 1775; Senate, Eastern Shore, Term of 1786–1791: 1786–1787 (elected on December 2, 1786, to fill vacancy; qualified on December 29, 1786), 1787–1788, 1788, 1789, 1790 (did not attend). OTHER STATE OFFICE: agent for purchasing provisions for Continental Army, appointed March 1778, resigned April 1778.
