

1 the language has been repealed, of course, it should be  
2 omitted. But that a new draft of a Declaration of  
3 Rights embracing the principles that are in the  
4 Committee's report be submitted but phrased in the  
5 language of the present Declaration of Rights so far as  
6 is possible. I make that motion.

7 THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Case, I suggest to you  
8 that the method that you have suggested will only  
9 result in considerable delay of the consideration of this  
10 report and end up with a section by section analysis  
11 exactly as we will have to go through today. There  
12 are a number of these sections that I am reasonably  
13 sure the Commission will want to approve in this form.  
14 There are a number of places where I am reasonably sure  
15 the Commission will want to include or substitute the  
16 language of the present Declaration. But to refer the  
17 matter back to the Committee with a broad general  
18 instruction such as you have suggested is only going  
19 to delay us for a month and end up with our having  
20 exactly the same thing.

21 MR. CASE: I disagree, Mr. Chairman.
