general instruction to try to incorporate the language 1 of the present Declaration. 2 DR. BURDETTE: I move we proceed in that 3 order. 4 I have so ruled unless we THE CHAIRMAN: 5 have to put it to a vote. 6 Could I ask Mr. Case a MR. MILLER: 7 question? 8 THE CHAIRMAN: Yes, sir. 9 MR. MILLER: Do I understand his authority? 10 Wou'd you modify the language that means the same thing 11 which the Committee has very well done? Are you suggest-12 ing we ought to, for historical reasons, take the Maryland 13 Bill of Rights when it says the same thing and they 14 followed the Federal. 15 In the first place, it is strange MR. CASE: 16 to think a State Constitution has to have in it a 17 bill of rights which says exactly what the Federal 18 Onstitution does in line with recent decisions of the 19 Supreme Court which makes the first ten amendments for 20

all practical purposes applicable to the states.
