MRS. BOTHE: As I see it, the proposed section 1 is not the identical thought to Article 1 of the existing Declaration of Rights which appears to specifically give the people the right to overthrow the government as also does Article 6.

Nowhere in the present or proposed Declaration of Rights is there any such sentiment expressed.

I think it is a good one, one that should remain in the Maryland Constitution perhaps in the traditional language. I query the Committee the mission of any reference.

PROFESSOR ASPER: It is a peculiar kind of Declaration of Rights that contains the seeds of its own destruction.

MRS. BOTHE: This is an affirmative right, not merely a laudatory right of the type Bob Martineau might belong --

PROFESSOR ASPER: Is it to be in the Constitution itself though, or the right to overthrow a constitutional government becomes principle.
