4 PROFESSOR ASPER: Where do we stand?

5 THE CHAIRMAN: The question before the
6 commission is Mr. Case's motion to substitute Article 1
7 of the present Declaration of Rights for Section 1 of
8 the draft proposed by the Committee. Is there further
9 discussion?

10 MR. BOND: I must confess I am sorely
11 troubled by this whole discussion. I am a traditionalist
12 but at the same time when you have a committee that met
13 a couple of months and who think they have been follow-
14 ing the instructions to have to completely overturn what
15 the Committee has done troubles me sorely. I don't know
16 where we can go if we vote aye for Mr. Case's motion.
17 That bothers me. What happens? Does everybody go back
18 to the drawing board? Is a compromise possible even
19 if they do go back?
