insofar as it is compatible with the rights that the

Committee has expressed, I think, the old language ought

to be used, not the new.

MR. CLAGETT: My idea is compatible with that.

THE CHAIRMAN: Would your motion be perhaps to substitute the first clause of the present Article 1 leaving out the second clause?

MR. CASE: Mr. Chairman, I again say that to

go down this thing and try to pick out the philosophy of which clause ought to be where and dove-tail with what section of the Committee's report is impossible to sit here and do that. If this motion loses, as it may very well lose, then I would move that the philosophy of Section 1 be accepted by the Commission but that it be returned to the Committee to phrase it in the language of the present Declaration of Rights insofar as that is possible.

THE CHAIRMAN: Let me suggest to you, Mr. Case, there are two philosophies in two clauses of Article 1.
