2 to include in the Declaration of Rights the philosophy  
3 of the second clause -- namely, of violent revolution,  
4 it certainly can be submitted, But I am just trying  
5 to find out --

6 MR. CASE: That is not my point. I don't  
7 care about it.

8 THE CHAIRMAN: Then the first clause is the  
9 clause you are particularly urging?

10 MR. CASE: I will read it.

11 DR. BURDETTE: I should like to express my  
12 disagreement with the interpretation of the Chair  
13 with regard to the second clause of Article 1 in the  
14 present Declaration of Rights. Indeed if I may, I  
15 will express some disagreement with the interpretations  
16 of modern reading that we seem to have here.

17 It is true that the compact theory of the  
18 origins of government has been largely discredited but  
19 really on the ground that nobody could find the compact.  
20 There is nothing wrong if we wanted to do it in saying  
21 this is our compact because one can find it.
