principle of whether the Commission wants this Committee to include in the Declaration of Rights the philosophy of the second clause -- namely, of violent revolution, it certainly can be submitted. But I am just trying to find out --

MR. CASE: That is not my point. I don't care about it.

THE CHAIRMAN: Then the first clause is the clause you are particularly urging?

MR. CASE: I will read it.

DR. BURDETTE: I should like to express my disagreement with the interpretation of the Chair with regard to the second clause of Article 1 in the present Declaration of Rights. Indeed if I may, I will express some disagreement with the interpretations of modern reading that we seem to have here.

It is true that the compact theory of the origins of government has been largely discredited but really on the ground that nobody could find the compact. There is nothing wrong if we wanted to do it in saying this is our compact because one can find it.
