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The reason for the discussion today stems from the fact that on this one issue, whether the recommendation should be for one or the other even though both are drafted, the Commission heretofore split almost evenly with a slight majority one way. They had a hearing with the legislative group. They split almost evently with a slight majority the other way. The Committee on its reconsideration, as I understand it, again split almost evenly but with a slight majority the opposite way.

I should have added that this Commission in its initial discussion of this issue almost went right down the middle also.

So that I think, Dr. Bard, you have gotten about as much help as you can get from this group today on this question.

DR. BARD: Yes, Mr. Chairman. I would

like to add this. Some of you may want to take notes
on papers and review them. First when you review Dr.

Graves' paper, which was rather definitive in this area,
