manifestly endangered, and all other means of redress are ineffectual, the People may, and of right ought, to reform the old, or establish a new Government; the doctrine of non-resistence against arbitrary power and oppression is abourd, slavish and destructive of the good and happiness c2 mankind."

They commend few, if any, of such provisions are judicially enforceable. We felt it was not language specially and pecularly Maryland's forefathers developed but was probably a justification of the revolution which had occurred just prior to this. They were justifying their actions in 1776.

MR. SCANLAN: I will vote against Mr. Case's motion, not that I am against the flag waving that is embraced therein, including going a step further than he, the right to violent revolution as the forefathers stated but I think all that exhortation should be in a preamble rather than the substitute for Section 1. On that ground alone, I am against it.
