papers that appeared in the 1920's.
THE CHAIRMAN: Let me suggest rather than
everybody try to make notes, when this matter is next
on the agenda for action by the Commission, I will ask
Mr. Brooks to append to the report of your Committee
a note calling attention to those earlier papers so they
can be reviewed.
DR. BARD: I think every member of the
Commission should have a copy of that portion of this
lengthy report which gives the views of members of the
Legislature.
MR. CASE: That has not been circulated.
