2 is directly contrary to what the Committee purposely  
3 sought here, and you may want to submit that question.

4 The language in Article 13 and Article 40 in  
5 several instances is precisely the kind of language that  
6 the Committee, as I understand it, has deliberately  
7 sought to avoid the use of; hath, for instance -- Every  
8 man hath the right to petition, and the use of, ought,  
9 in several instances. Now, are you suggesting or was it  
10 your idea to suggest a motion that that kind of language  
11 be preserved?

12 MR. CASE: I think the language in the Declara-  
13 tion of Rights that the language that, Every citizen of  
14 the State ought to be allowed to speak, write and pub-  
15 lish his sentiments on all subjects is good language,  
16 and it is my motion that this Section be referred to the  
17 Committee with the instruction that where the language  
18 meets the point that they have made, that the language in  
19 the existing Declaration of Rights be used.
