It's got built-in reservations to it, the word that suffers is the word of, ought, which doesn't mean the same as, shall.

another respect along the lines of what Mr. Gentry just said, Section 2 guarantees the right peaceably to assemble, which is not guaranteed in the present Constitution, and I suggest the events of recent days suggest this is not an academic right, and in that respect, this second respect, Section 2 as proposed by the Committee is an improvement over what we have in the old Constitution.

THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Bond?

MR. BOND: I would suggest that Article 13
which is superseded should not go into the new Constitution.
That says, Every man hath the right to petition the
Legislature to redresshis grievances in a peaceful and
orderly manner. I think that is an example of the
language that can be left stand.
