DR. BARD: I would just like to explain the fact that in general I am in agreement with Mr. Case that where the language of the Constitution, the present language of the Constitution states clearly the concept that the Committee is attempting to set forth, then I think it is better to use the language of the Constitution. In this case, I believe that it embraces more than language. It defines ideas and for this reason, I believe that the wording as stated here is superior to the wording as it is noted, the ideas are more clear.

THE CHAIRMAN: All right, you ready? Mr. Case?

MR. CASE: So you can be definitive, what I

would have in mind if this word, referred, would be then
appearing in the discussion, the people have the right
peaceably to assemble and patition each branch of the
Government for the redress of grievances, and then come
in to the second sentence that, every citizen shall be
allowed to speak, write, and publish his sentiments on
all subjects being responsible for the abuse of that
privilege.
