3 DR. JENKINS: We should not limit this to,  
4 citizen, because this is simply not a protection to the  
5 individual, protection of the people to have a right to  
6 know which may come from outside the area of citizens.

7 MR. MILLER: I am concerned, Doctor, with  
8 the situation where we may be confronted with it where  
9 an organized move comes in that isn't based on any  
10 citizenship right, but it might hamper the courts who  
11 say, You can't do this. Now, it is true they might stand  
12 responsible and be deported to Moscow or something, but  
13 I don't see why we should necessarily give everybody a  
14 right to do anything, no matter how irresponsible he is.

15 DR. JENKINS: That is what we ought to do.

16 MRS. BOTHE: It is not a question of the in-  
17 dividual's right, but a question of what can be done  
18 within the State of Maryland, where everybody here has  
19 a right of free speech and free assembly whoever they  
20 happen to be, foreign dogs and cats, for that matter.
