

1 recommended by the Committee, it says. No person shall
2 be restricted in the free exercise, et cetera, and
3 referring back to Article 36, there is a restriction
4 which is not included here in the Committee recommendation,
5 and it appears unless under the color of religion he
6 shall disturb the good order, peace or safety of the
7 State or infringe the laws of morality or injure others,
8 et cetera.

9 I feel that there again, going back to Mr.
10 Case's original objection, we have a means of incorporat-
11 ing a language which has something unique about it as
12 well as a very, very beneficial restriction upon the
13 free exercise of religious profession.

14 I don't know that everybody is entitled to be
15 so free and easy in that exercise.

16 PROFESSOR ASPER: Just one comment. That
17 language is not at all unique. The language just referred
18 to by Mr. Clagett is not at all unique in the Maryland
19 Constitution. Our thought was, it was unnecessary.
