

1 Every man shall have the right to worship God in such  
2 manner as he thinks most acceptable to him, and all per-  
3 sons are equally entitled to the protection of their  
4 religious liberties wherefore no person shall by any law  
5 be molested in his person or estate on account of his  
6 religious persuasion or profession or for his religious  
7 practice.

8 That is my motion to substitute those great  
9 words.

10 THE CHAIRMAN: A second.

11 MR. CASE: And I again say for the sterile  
12 language which has been used here which admittedly means  
13 the same thing, may even say it better, but it hasn't  
14 said it as long.

15 MR. SCANLAN: Happy for your last comment.

16 THE CHAIRMAN: Any second?

17 MRS. BOTHE: I am a little concerned. I may  
18 be off Mr. Case's motion slightly, but I believe Mr. Asper  
19 commented that it was unnecessary to put this prohibition  
20 on the uninhibited use of religion. The United States
