respecting the establishment of religion such as the first phrase of this proposed Section 3, but our proposed language here that no person shall be restricted, et ceters, I feel might possibly enable. I know I personally have been mixed up with some cases in Black Muslims in the Penetentiary who want to disrupt the whole administration of the discipline there, and I am not at all sure after doing some research into the applicable law that under this proposed language which goes further than the Federal Constitution wouldn't put those people in a position to continue.

I don't think anybody wants them to have the Constitution to do it.

PROFESSOR ASPER: You are obviously better informed than I am. You have been doing research on the point. Under the ordinary police powers of the State, power to prevent abuse of practices, disruptive practices, even at --

MRS. BOTHE: This says, No person shall be restricted in the free exercise of religious profession and worship -- period. That goes further than the Federal
